##### [Public health advice and support arrangements into integrated care systems in England](#)

Public Health England - July 2019

Local NHS organisations in England are increasingly focused on their contribution to population health outcomes through new integrated care systems (ICSs). ICSs provide a mechanism for local partners to lead the planning and commissioning of care for their populations, providing system leadership and accountability at scale across local authority and clinical commissioning group boundaries. Directors of public health and their teams are vital to the development, leadership and influencing of local population health plans and this note focuses specifically on their role in England.

In May 2019 the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Social Work and the British Association of Social Workers launched a new inquiry: Social Workers and a New Mental Health Act. The inquiry was established in response to the Independent Review of the Mental Health Act 1983, published in December 2018.

##### [NHS launches accredited suppliers for electronic patient records](#)

NHS England - 5 August 2019

NHSX and NHS England have published a list of accredited suppliers of electronic patient record solutions, to give purchasers in the NHS more confidence in their route to digitisation. The framework was created to provide services that support the delivery of integrated care – including population health management – and the new EPR section will provide access to supplier systems able to meet the [Global Digital Exemplars \(GDE\) standards](#). It will mean Trusts and other NHS entities can digitise more quickly.

### [Patient Safety Incident Response Framework \(PSIRF\) update](#)

#### NHS Improvement - 14 August 2019

Following the launch of the [NHS Patient Safety Strategy](#), we have updated our timescales for the PSIRF — which we expect to replace the existing [Serious Incident Framework](#) by 2021.

The [new framework](#) will be published as introductory guidance this autumn, with a small number of NHS providers testing early implementation.

### [NHS Widening Digital Participation: improving healthcare outcomes through digital inclusion](#)

#### Good Things Foundation Digital Health Lab - August 2019

The Good Things Foundation are working with NHS Digital to pilot 20 different ways to embed digital inclusion into healthcare. The aim of the programme is to design, test and iterate 20 different pathfinders over 12 months that, if successful, can be scaled across other areas of the country.
